When the landscape of your life changes, it can be difficult to adjust to your new view. Unfamiliarity can induce feelings of anxiety and sadness, and it can be especially difficult to explore these new territories by yourself. Lillie, 85, a recipient of Meals on Wheels, has dealt with significant changes in her life, specifically over the past few years. Although Lillie has only been our client for a short time, her quality of life has improved significantly, and much of this is attributed to her beloved delivery driver, Joseph Carson.

Joseph has been working at Meals on Wheels as a Site Coordinator for two years, delivering meals and building relationships with our downtown clients. We have had difficulty keeping volunteers on our downtown route, and Joseph has graciously taken over Lillie's deliveries. When asked what his first impression of his client Lillie was, he said, "I immediately fell in love. She opened the door with a smile, and I smiled back."

When asked if she likes visits from Joseph, Lillie beamed, "I certainly do! He's a wonderful person." Lillie shared that she was feeling "miserable" – and then Joseph came into her life. Joseph makes Lillie's bad days better. She expressed that, "At this age, with so many different things happening, you feel kinda bad." She describes how her life has changed over the years, including how her husband and friends have passed away. Without Meals on Wheels, Lillie said that, *"It would be a very lonesome life.*" What Lillie expressed about her life is what thousands of seniors are experiencing in San Diego County: a lack of fruitful and fulfilling social connection.

Our mission at Meals on Wheels is to not only combat senior hunger, but also senior isolation. With the help of our dedicated employees and volunteers, we bring this mission to life. In this rapidly changing world, we want to be a source of consistency in our clients' lives. They get the satisfaction of looking forward to that knock on their door and a friendly face to greet them. When describing the impact Joseph has had on her mood, Lillie exclaims, "It's a pleasure for him to come by with his happy face. It makes me feel good."

Lillie reminds us that, although life transitions can be difficult, having the right support system can get us through. It can take some time to adjust to the new terrains in our life, but certain people can help us find the beauty in the unfamiliarity.

Volunteer Spotlight

"You will find it very rewarding!" says Lynette, an East County volunteer, about volunteering with Meals on Wheels. Born and raised in San Diego, Lynette has dedicated her life to serving her community. After retirement, Lynette decided to spend her time volunteering; she had heard about Meals on Wheels and recognized the importance of healthy eating. Lynette says the most important aspect of Meals on Wheels is making sure that healthy food is on the table for folks who may not be able to purchase or prepare it on their own. Her dedication to serving her community seems to be hereditary, as her daughter and granddaughter also volunteer for Meals on Wheels and continuously give back to the community through the SPRITES of East County.

Volunteers like Lynette are not just devoted to providing nutritious meals to our clients – they are also dedicated to our clients' safety. Lynette recalls an instance where she was knocking on a client's door, but no one was answering. She heard the client speaking and deciphered that the client had fallen and was unable to get up. With the help of neighbors, Lynette was able to get to the client in need and called 911.

When reflecting on this experience, Lynette states, "That was really a time that I felt it was important I was there." Whether a delivery becomes a life-saving rescue or not, we believe that it is important every single time our volunteers are there for our clients. Our volunteers are the unsung heroes of our community and demonstrate every day that there is power in showing up for those in need. To some people, a knock on a door is not a heroic act, but we know that something so simple can mean so much to the safety of our clients.

To those considering becoming a Meals on Wheels volunteer, Lynette shares how easy the delivery process is, from the flexible scheduling to being able to select the routes that are most convenient for you. If a volunteer needs some support, Lynette reassures, "The office support staff is always available to help if a client is not home or if I have a concern along my route." And if you don't want to volunteer alone, you don't have to! You can be accompanied by your friends and family.



North County Service Center welcomed Brown University PCORI Deliver-EE Research Team to our service center in June. North County Service Center is part of a study with 8 additional Meals on Wheels Programs in the United States. The research is looking at various outcomes for seniors receiving deliveries versus drop-shipped frozen meals. MOWSDC North County has reached 53% of our project goal. Through Brown University, we have assisted 50 clients to receive daily deliveries and 55 clients with weekly frozen meals.

We have exciting happenings here at the Meal Center! We are currently converting 80% of our vans to electric vehicles. We are revising and improving our 6-week-cycle vegetarian menu. We are also incorporating dishes from our Southern comfort menu into our regular lunch menu. The clients are truly enjoying these new dishes!
